

Got your **bike,** but **where to ride?**

Most legal places to ride unregistered bikes are located in private motor parks and motorcycle club tracks. While they are great places to visit, strict rules apply to State forests and forest reserves where only leisure riding on formed roads by fully licensed riders on registered bikes is allowed. Organised events like club rides and large groups are likely to require a permit.

Like any sport you may need to travel to your site of play. Remember it's a good idea to ride with a mate for safety reasons but it's also a great way to get a lift. The laws and regulations that control how and where you use your dirt bike are important. They help to keep you out of trouble; they keep the sport healthy by controlling less responsible riders; they help protect the land you ride on and the people who own it.

It is illegal to ride dirt bikes in parks, bushland, easements or any other open space. Always obey posted signs. The Police and Council administer the laws regulating illegal riding of trail bikes including unlicensed, unregistered and unroadworthy trail bikes. The Queensland Police have powers under the Police Powers and Responsibility Act 2000 which allows them to issue noise abatement orders and seize or confiscate bikes. The Council through their local laws can issue on the spot fines and a maximum fine of up to \$1500. Queensland Parks & Wildlife Service and Forest Products Queensland Rangers and Officers issue on the spot fines for breaches of the Forestry 1959 and Nature Conservation Act 1992.

So play it **safe,** have **fun**
and **ride legal.**
