A DAY IN THE LIFE: THE WORST OF THE WORST

Redcliffe Museum School program

Teacher excursion information

At *Redcliffe Museum*, Year Three and Four students and supporting adults will explore the history of the Redcliffe Peninsular and the convict experience of the first Moreton Bay Penal Colony.

Planning your visit

 \checkmark Please ensure no more than 60 students are on-site each day. Prior to arrival, please ensure students are broken evenly across 3 groups of no more than 20 students each.

 \checkmark If your excursion requires multiple dates, please ensure each day has approximately the same number of students.

 \checkmark Inform the museum if your group consists of any persons with individual accessibility requirements, and if deemed necessary, highlight any students with individual learning needs.

 \checkmark When booking please indicate any relevant allergies and/or medical conditions. While all Moreton Bay Regional Council facilities have on-site first aid kits available, it is strongly recommended that all education groups provide their own.

 \checkmark We require 1 supervising adult per 15 students. Please ensure there are enough teachers and accompanying adults to provide adequate supervision of students.

Preparing students for their excursion

 \checkmark Throughout the day museum staff will deliver activities in period-costume while in character. Please outline this to students in preparation for the experiences they will encounter.

 \checkmark Please ensure each session commences with students lined up behind the appropriate activity signage.

 \checkmark Students will need to bring their own:

o Hat - allocated breaks will be spent outdoors, weather permitting.

o Food for morning-tea and lunch breaks.

o Water-bottle (on-site facilities available for refills throughout the day).

What to expect when you visit the museum

Students will participate in hands-on, interactive activities that explore elements of the lives that convicts lived and their experience here in Moreton Bay. The opportunity to interact with museum objects, props and costumes will be interwoven into activities throughout the day. On the day of your excursion, you should expect the following:

 \checkmark When arriving at the Museum students should file onto the grassy area beside the entrance to the museum, near the Matthew Flinders monument for their morning tea break.

 \checkmark Students will be asked to place their bags away in our designated storage area and line-up behind the sign that correlates to their group.

 \checkmark Each group will complete 2 activities (previously selected) and enjoy a third session exploring the museum and theatre as outlined in the provided timetable.

 \checkmark Each activity will run for a 30-minute period.

 \checkmark Teachers and supporting adults are required to administer behaviour management when necessary.

 \checkmark Museum staff will appear both in character and in the role of facilitator, with clear definitions of each framed through costuming.
