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Overview

The *Time Traveller's* Kindy Program is an interactive education program which aligns with the current Australian Curriculum for Foundation HASS. It is designed by Redcliffe Museum to support kindy and pre-school educator's history programs and to enrich learning.

During the program, children will participate in a variety of learning experiences based on interactive learning through discovery and play.

Through questioning, comparison, mark making and drawing activities children will engage with ideas about the past and explore how people lived; the tools people used, the clothes they wore, what they did for fun, how they completed their chores, and what they did for work.

Through these activities they will interactively explore objects and stories that activate the past and enliven the present and the future.

Activities

Time Traveller's Kit: Objects from the past

Children/ students will be gathered into groups and given a cardboard featuring a pictorial clipboard and a magnifying glass, which we will use to explore the museum to find the Time Traveller's symbols. The symbols are positioned at specific displays around the museum. At each symbol, the group will explore one idea/ concept about the past by engaging with the display, or object from our Memory box collection.

Time Traveller's Kit: Story Time

The Children/ students gather into smaller groups on our story mat for Time Traveller's Story Time, where we read an excerpt from Margo Neale & Lynne Kelly's *First Knowledges for younger readers: Songlines*. The children/ students are issued with a clipboard and paper, which they use to follow along with the story, creating pictures as they go.

Time Traveller's Kit: Memory Capture

To complete their kit, the Time Traveller's will each be given a camera cut-out to colour in and then they may choose an object that has been 'collected' throughout the activities to 'capture' memories of their travels through time in the museum.
