


#2 Zoning Map

Performance Commentary

69 media releases were produced during the reporting period, with 91% of these published by media. Key publicity generated included Moreton Bay SES being named regional unit of the year, breaking ground on Rothwell's AFL precinct, unveiling of the Hills District All Abilities Playground and opening of Sandstone Point's BIG4 Caravan Park. The major media success story was the launch of Aqua Splash in Clontarf, which was covered by all local media outlets and both Channels 7 and 9 in the lead-up to its arrival and again when it officially opened. Stories around 'National Recycling Week' were largely overlooked by local media, so we will refine those strategies and communications for 2019 to try to achieve greater prominence.

Council-run and sponsored events continued to maintain a high-level of positive community feedback. Council conducted five events during the reporting period including two Australian Citizenship Ceremonies, two divisional events as well as the annual Battle of the Brains competition. Approximately 1500 people attended the Picnic in the Park Enviro Explorers (Division 12) with almost 90% satisfaction with the event. Ferny Hills Picnic in the Park (Division 10) was attended by more than 1000 people with more than 95% satisfaction.

Council worked closely with MBRIT on nine sponsored events during the quarter. This included Moreton Kids Festival, Volunteer Recognition Function, Business Conference Series 4, Business Excellence & Innovation Awards, Caboolture Christmas Carols, North Lakes Christmas Carols, Pine Rivers Christmas Carols, Scarborough Christmas Carols and Community Christmas Day Lunch.

In its second-year, Moreton Kids Festival experienced a record attendance of more than 10,000 people with satisfaction of more than 84%. Caboolture and North Lakes Christmas carols were relocated to Centenary Lakes and Kinsellas Sports Fields respectively. Both events were overwhelmingly successful, with improved layout achieving increased attendance and positive feedback from residents. Pine Rivers Christmas Carols was cancelled due to inclement weather.

The 2018 Business Innovation and Excellence Awards in November received a record number of nominations, with the sold-out Gala Awards receiving overwhelmingly positive feedback from attendees with 94% satisfaction. Positive feedback was also received from volunteers who attended the Volunteer Recognition Function.

Together, these events catered for more than 28,600 patrons with an average satisfaction rating of 87%.

Performance Commentary continued.

Operations: All schedules are up to date, With the drier weather for this time of year, all Parks crews (Internal and External) are on schedule even despite the Xmas and New Year break. The Roads crews are also on schedule. The Pothole patching trial undertaken through the last quarter, which has allowed for all patching trucks to be programmed for the 1st time, has proven successful with significant increases in output from the same time last year.

Fleet: Servicing programs being undertaken for Heavy, Light Fleet and small equipment are in accordance with Fleets implemented maintenance schedules and manufactures servicing specifications. Fleets maintenance activities for the last quarter show both Heavy and Light Fleet reactive versus proactive maintenance reports a 30% reactive and 70% proactive result, Small plant is showing 21% reactive and a 79% proactive result. Fleet replacement is in progress with new assets being received for Heavy, Light Fleet and Small plant in accordance with the 18/19 replacement program.

Building and Facilities: Graffiti: under target at 93.05 - Current vacant position within the graffiti team is affecting the time frames for completion. It is anticipated that the vacant role will be filled within Q3 which will improve the KPI performance. B&F Reactive under target at 93.2 - Vacant Team Leader roles within the structure is putting pressure on areas within the B&F Operations team. Roles are currently out to market with recruitment likely within Q3. B&F Programmed Maintenance activities on track for EOFY.
