Narrow-leaf Ironbark (*Eucalyptus crebra*) and Blue Gum (*E. tereticornis*) grassy woodland

Description: Eucalyptus crebra, E. tereticornis grassy woodland. Other species including Eucalyptus

melanophloia, Corymbia clarksoniana, C. erythrophloia, C. tessellaris, Angophora spp. may be present in low densities or in patches. Mid- layer generally sparse but can include low trees such as Acacia bidwillii, Capparis spp., Dodonaea triquetra, Alphitonia excelsa and Xanthorrhoea spp. Occurs on mid and lower slopes on Paleozoic and older moderately to strongly deformed and

metamorphosed sediments and interbedded volcanics.

Conservation status: Vegetation Management Act (Qld) 1999 - of concern (14.82 % remaining locally)
