

Species List for Regional Ecosystem 12.3.1

Riparian Rainforest

Description: This ecosystem occurs along creeks and riverbanks on well-drained coarse alluvium soil. Riparian rainforest ecosystems are high in biodiversity and provide important corridors for the migration of many native birds and animals. Species found include: Weeping myrtle (*Waterhousea floribunda*) - dominant, Rib-fruit Pepperberry (*Cryptocarya hypospodia*), Pepperberry tree (*C. obovata*), Brown Laurel (*C. triplinervis*), Brown Tulip Oak (*Argyrodendron trifoliolatum*), Creek sandpaper fig (*Ficus coronata*), Sandpaper fig (*F. fraseri*), Black Bean (*Castanospermum australe*) and Hoop Pine (*Araucaria cunninghamii*)

Ecological values: This ecosystem provides habitat for numerous rare and threatened flora including Maroochy Nut (*Macadamia ternifolia*) and Queensland Nut (*Macadamia integrifolia*). Prone to invasion by Camphor Laurel (*Cinnamomum camphora*) and Cat's Claw Creeper (*Macfadyena unguis-cati*). Important habitat for fruit-eating birds, many of which migrate seasonally from upland to lowland rainforest

Conservation status: *Vegetation Management Act (Qld) 1999* - endangered (15.14 % remaining locally)




Figure 1: Representative areas in the MBRC where RE 12.3.1 can be found
