The 2025 program features three weekend micro-festivals at Redcliffe, North Lakes, and Caboolture as well as a Live Music Trail with free gigs throughout the month.

Our venues transform to be the new favourite haunts of music lovers and music makers, amplifying the sounds of local professional musicians, community music makers and providing opportunities for everyone to participate.

Get hands-on with ukulele, bucket drumming and digital music making workshops, all designed for absolute beginners.

Following the success of the People's Piano in 2024, there will be four public instruments on offer at local libraries as well as musical responses to gallery and museum exhibitions and performances by school and community musicians.

There is so much to hear with over 70 free events. Tune into local performers across all corners of the city and make your own sensational sounds.

So gather your friends and family, join the chorus and create unforgettable musical memories!

From solo acts to full big bands, the Live Music Trail offers 30 to 90-minute live gigs with music to suit every taste and age.

If a sing-along is more your style, check out the range of gigs where you can join the chorus and follow along with the lyrics of classic songs.

After-hours is more your style? If so, grab your friends and head over to your local library, gallery, or museum for an early evening performance.
