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

Ali and Lina get ready for bushfires




Lina sees her neighbour Tom. Tom is mowing the grass.





Tom tells Lina, "I mow the grass often, because we live close to the bush." Tom shows Lina the QFES Bushfire Post Code Checker on his phone.



Lina uses the Bushfire Post Code Checker and tells Ali, "We must prepare for bushfire season, because we live in a high risk area".





Ali rakes and removes leaves from the yard and Lina cuts the low tree branches.



Lina mows the grass and Ali clears the roof gutters.





Ali and Lina make a bushfire evacuation kit. They may need to leave their home. Now the family is ready for bushfire season.



FIRE DANGER RATINGS



Low-Moderate

Fire fighters can control the fire easily. There is **no** danger to people or property.

High

Fire fighters can control the fire. There is a **small** risk of damage to property.

Very High

Fire fighters <u>may not</u> control the fire. The fire may <u>damage</u> some properties

Severe

Fire fighters <u>may not</u> control the fire. The fire may move <u>quickly</u>. The fire may <u>destroy</u> properties.

Extreme

Fire fighters <u>may not</u> control the fire. The fire may move <u>very quickly</u>. The fire may change <u>direction</u> quickly. It may destroy <u>more</u> properties.



Fire fighters <u>may not</u> control the fire. The fire may move <u>extremely quickly</u>. The fire may change <u>direction</u> quickly. It may destroy <u>many</u> properties.
