## Monitoring the coast

Our coast is continually changed by storms, tides, and other natural processes that can impact beaches, the landscape, wildlife and vegetation. Council has proudly introduced a community photo monitoring system called CoastSnap. Cradles have been installed at nine regional sites. Just see it, snap it and share it to help take care of our coastline!

## See it, snap it, share it

Simply place your phone in the cradle, snap a photo of the coastline, and share it using a free App or on Social Media.

### 1 Download

- CoastSnap App
- Create an account with your email address

### 2 See

- A CoastSnap location
- Select CoastSnap location on your App

### 3 Snap

- Add your snap using the plus button to 'update spot'
- Place phone in cradle and take a landscape photo\*

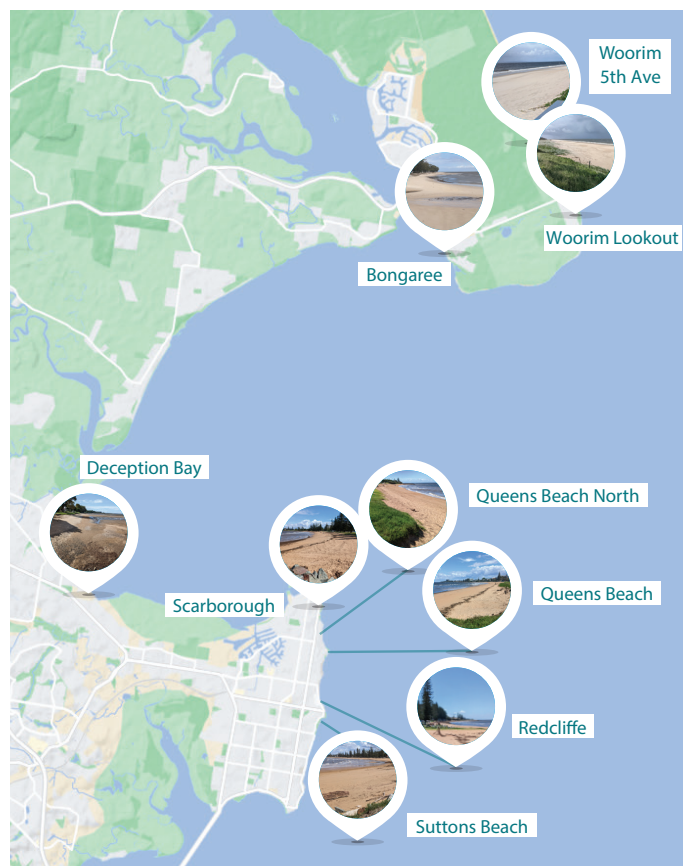
### 4 Share
