

Community Wellbeing Strategy - Progress Snapshot

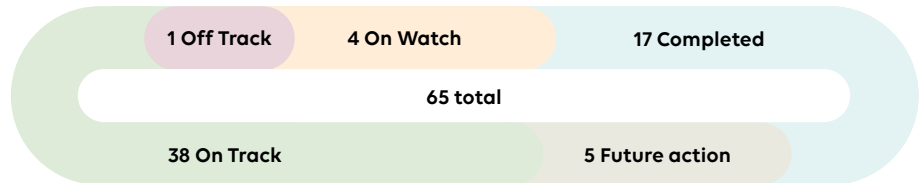
July 2023 - June 2024

The Community Wellbeing Strategy (CWS), adopted by City of Moreton Bay in 2023, is a long-term roadmap to guide the actions of Council and our communities to progress community wellbeing over the next 20 years. It's a key delivery strategy for the Corporate Plan 2022 - 2027: Our Vibrant Communities Pillar. The CWS has 4 high level outcomes with associated action plans:

Healthy and Active Communities **Connected Communities** **Safe and Resilient Communities** **Creative Communities**

Current Status of Actions

There is a total of 65 actions across the 4 Action Plans, to be delivered between 2023 - 2026.

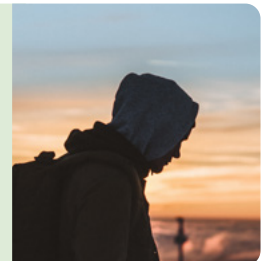


Innovate Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP)

Council's Innovate RAP was endorsed by Reconciliation Australia in November 2023 and adopted by Council in December 2023. Marking a significant milestone in Council's long-term reconciliation journey, the RAP will strengthen Council's relationships with the city's three Traditional Custodian groups, community Elders, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

Housing and Homelessness Action Plan (HHAP)

The HHAP is Council's response to critical issues of housing insecurity and homelessness in our city. It focuses on supports for people sleeping rough, achieving well-managed public spaces, stronger partnerships with community and government and supporting development of housing.



Waraba Community Needs and Social Infrastructure Assessment (WCNSIA)

Investing in social infrastructure is crucial in delivering welcoming liveable communities. The WCNSIA will inform Council's long-term planning, advocacy, partnerships, and investment for community infrastructure in Waraba, which is estimated to see 30,000 new homes and 70,000 residents over the next 40 years.

Moreton Bay Eco Fest

Eco-Fest was a crowd pleaser, attracting 1500 attendees in 2023. This event offered a diverse range of information and activities across 35 stalls and over 15 presentations. Visitors learned about sustainability, how to manage their carbon footprint, new green technologies, and strategies for implementing a sustainable green budget through a series of talks and workshops.
