

























# The Greater Moreton Bay Region's University is the best location for a new University in Australia based on current demographics






Australia, Brisbane and the Sunshine Coast will continue to **add population** over the next 20 years ... transportation infrastructure is being upgraded in the region



Australia is shifting to knowledge work requiring the workforce to **up-skill** through university and technical education



Australia has 40 universities with **1.3 million students** growing at 36,000 per year ... the average university has 33,000 students



There are 6,000 university places to service 613,000 residents on the Greater Moreton Bay Region... no other part of any major city in Australia is as **poorly served** by local universities



### For too long Moreton has been overlooked... the time for a local University is now
