Recognised dog breeder association details

In Queensland, if you breed a dog on or after 26 May 2017 you must be registered as a breeder. This means that, unless you're a primary producer breeding working dogs to be kept on rural land for use as working dogs, you must register - even if your dog has an unplanned litter or you only breed puppies for family and friends. When you register with Department of Agriculture and Fisheries (DAF), you'll receive a unique identification number - your supply number - that can be used to trace every dog you breed back to you.

Additional animal approval - Recognised breeder - Owner checklist

Dogs

- Approved animals are registered.
- Approved animals are microchipped, the details have been provided to Council and match Councils record for each approved animal.
- Dogs must wear an identification tag when at a place other than their registered address.
- For keeping a dog on land that is within a koala area, if a koala is on land to which a dog has access, or if the responsible person for a dog becomes aware there is a koala at large on land where the dog is kept, the responsible person for the dog must—
 - a. tether the dog to prevent it from attacking a koala until the koala has left the land; and
 - b. contain the dog by placing the dog in an enclosure between sunset and sunrise to prevent it from attacking a koala.
- Whelping areas must comply with Queensland Animal Welfare Standards and Guidelines for Breeding dogs and their progeny.

Important Information

Term of approval

Additional animal approvals are not renewable however approval holders are required to uphold the requirements of their approval.

Change to animals kept under an approval

Approval holders are not permitted to replace or transfer an animal approved under an additional animal approval. To make changes to the approved animals a new application is required.

Cancellation of approval

If an additional animal approval is no longer required or if any circumstances relating to the approval should change notification in writing must be made to Council within 7 days.

Minimum standards for keeping animals

Animals must be kept in accordance with the requirements of the Moreton Bay City Council Local Laws and relevant State legislation.

What is a supply number?

Your supply number must be included in the dog's microchip information. It will identify all dogs and puppies that you breed and provides lifetime traceability of a dog's origin. A supply number can be any one of the following:

- breeder identification number - available online when you register as a breeder
- breeder's membership number - provided by a breeder organisation that accredits dog breeders and is approved by the Minister as an 'approved entity'
- breeder permit number - provided by a local government issuing permits/registrations to dog breeders and approved by the Minister as an 'approved entity'
- a unique number that identifies a person as a recognised interstate breeder—provided within their state
- breeder exemption number - available to eligible people who qualify for breeder exemption.

You must not give away, sell or advertise a dog or puppy without a supply number that identifies you as the breeder or provides an exemption.

All breeders and suppliers, including pet shops, must display the supply number when giving away, selling or advertising dogs and puppies. You must:

- display your supply number on every advertisement
- include your supply number in the dog's microchip information
- provide your supply number to the dog's new owner.

Recognised Breeder Property Inspection

An Authorised Officer will conduct a property inspection as part of the assessment of your application to ensure you comply with the required conditions to obtain an approval to keep additional dogs for breeding purposes.
