

## CHAPTER 4 - ZONE ASSESSMENT TABLES

### PART 1 PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS FOR ZONE ASSESSMENT TABLES

#### Division 1 Preliminary

##### 1.1 Assessment Categories for Development

The assessment categories are identified for development in each **zone** in column 2 of Tables 4.2 – 4.25, (Parts 2 - 25), as follows:-

- (1) Tables 4.2 – 4.24: for a material change of use and associated works for a use listed in column 1 for each **zone**; or
- (2) Table 4.25: other development not associated with a material change of use listed in column 1 for all **zones** including:-
  - (a) reconfiguring a lot;
  - (b) operational works for reconfiguring a lot;
  - (c) building work not associated with an advertising sign;
  - (d) advertising signs (building work and operational work);
  - (e) operational work for access and parking facilities; and
  - (f) operational works for excavation and filling not associated with reconfiguring a lot.

##### 1.2 Relevant Assessment Criteria for Self-Assessable Development and Code Assessable Development in Each Zone

- (1) The relevant assessment criteria for a material change of use and associated works in each **zone** are referred to in column 3 of Tables 4.2 – 4.24 in Parts 2 –24;
- (2) The relevant assessment criteria for other development not associated with a material change of use in all **zones** are referred to in column 3 of Table 4.25 in Part 25; and
- (3) For self-assessable development and code assessable development, the relevant assessment criteria are applicable codes.
