2024 looks to be a busy year as Council progresses projects to support our community right here on the Peninsula. Construction of a new Homelessness Hub operated by the Redcliffe Breakfast Club and Salvation Army is underway, the Mousetrap Theatre have tenure over the Sutton Centre in Sutton Street, Redcliffe (Opposite Bee Gees Way), and funding, plans and a design competition are advancing on the Suttons Beach Public Space Project.

It's also a big year for environmental measures, including a new garden waste bin service (below) while Bellevue Park playground was made from 70% recycled products with the posts of the unit being recycled shopping bags and textiles and the play panels recycled from fishing nets.

New Garden Waste Wheelie Bin

City of Moreton Bay has awarded an organics collection service contract scheduled to commence at the end of the year.

With food scraps and garden clippings forming nearly half of all waste in domestic general waste bins, this initiative is a significant step towards environmental sustainability and proactive waste management.

Our organics collection service is set to unfold in two stages. Stage 1 is the implementation of a garden organics (GO) service with a new 204L lime green lidded bin and collection service aimed to commence in December.

Stage 2 will transition the GO service to a Food Organic Garden Organic (FOGO) service contingent upon securing access to food and organics processing.

A large facility with a footprint of around 55,000 square metres will need to be developed and built to process the FOGO material (Stage 2).

Once funding is secured, we can proceed with a tender process to construct an industrial facility to process all food and garden waste within our local government area. The site would be responsible for processing an estimated 60,000 to 120,000 tonnes of organic waste annually.

The Sutton Centre is a perfect fit for Mousetrap Theatre, it's adjacent to Bee Gees Way and close to restaurants and hospitality. I can't think of a better place for dinner and a show! The theatre will also further activate Sutton Street and bring more foot traffic to the area.

It was great to work alongside Mousetrap and Council to see this opportunity come together while long-term planning for a bespoke community theatre is considered.

DISASTER DASHBOARD

We all know that living in Moreton Bay means being prepared for extreme weather all year round, but this summer is particularly unpredictable with bushfires and storms both presenting a threat.

City of Moreton Bay is helping you prepare should the unthinkable happen, by providing a free emergency warning system called MoretonAlert.

Receive real-time SMS, email or voice message before and during an emergency weather event by signing up today at moretonbay.qld.gov.au/moretonalert

The success of this service relies upon having accurate information, so now is the time to make sure your details are correct and up to date so you don't miss out on critical information that could save your life.

Current SMS subscribers will have already received a text message from the number (04 0817 0536) to update their details, so it's safe to save this number and be confident that it isn't spam. We will be following up with an email next month.

For all other information during an emergency event, please visit Council's Disaster Dashboard to get updates on bushfire warnings, sandbag stations, evacuation centres, road closures, and so much more.

I trust you had a good break over the holiday season and here's to 2024!

In our first full year as a city, 2024 will see Council continue to focus on the needs of our communities first, including advocating for our fair share of funding especially for infrastructure, while also conserving our distinctive lifestyle and wildlife corridors, against the backdrop of population growth.

Realising our priority of 'going green as we grow', Council will roll out the first phase of a dedicated food organics and garden organics (FOGO) waste kerbside collection service from late 2024. Phase one will see the introduction of a garden organics collection service (GO) where lime green lidded bins will be distributed. Once processing facilities have been secured, waste collection will transition to a complete FOGO service. FOGO will increase our city's recycling rate, reduce landfill and see resources produced from recovered materials.

Another significant step forward is the allocation of council-owned land at Dakabin for the construction of a dedicated wildlife hospital. Currently, a gap in the SEQ wildlife hospital network means injured wildlife rescuers travel up to two hours for animal care. We're urgently seeking financial support from state and federal governments to bring this vital facility to fruition.

Council's ambitious goal of protecting 75% of City of Moreton Bay's landmass from development will ensure that housing and infrastructure to accommodate a booming

population is balanced with the preservation of our flora and fauna.

This commitment to balance growth extends to housing and homelessness challenges. The Housing and Homelessness Action Plan (HHAP) outlines key activities addressing affordability and homelessness over the next five years. We're offering council-owned land in Morayfield and Caboolture for potential social, affordable or crisis housing developments, guided by changes in our Community Leasing Policy.

We're also continuing the Attraction of Affordable Social Housing Development Policy, waiving fees for developers. Already, this initiative has helped people experiencing homelessness secure accommodation at Bric Housing's recently completed 18-dwelling accommodation block at Redcliffe with more to be realised this year.

And we're taking the cost-of-living pressure off families with Council's extensive calendar of free events from movie nights to Lunar New Year celebrations.

Council looks forward to continuing to support our communities, protect and enhance our natural spaces, and maintain sustainable lifestyles this year as we work together to bring our living city vision to life.

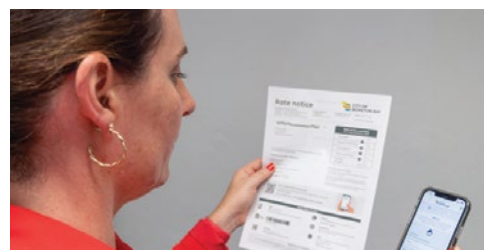
