Protect what matters most

How to plan, prepare and survive during bushfire and severe weather season

Heavy rains, floods and bushfires can strike with little warning. Taking simple steps now can help keep your family safe, reduce damage to your home and make recovery easier.

Here's how to get prepared this season:

- Know your risk: Use City of Moreton Bay's Flood Check Property Reports to check your property's flood risk
- Make a plan: Create a household emergency plan
- Pack an emergency kit: Include essentials to stay safe and self-sufficient for at least three days

- Prepare your home: Clear gutters, trim trees, check your roof and secure loose items
- Stay informed:
 - Bookmark Council's Disaster
 Dashboard for real-time updates,
 road closures, weather alerts and more at disaster.moretonbay.qld.gov.au
 - Refer to the Bureau of Meteorology for weather updates and warnings
 - Register to MoretonAlert for notifications on severe weather, bushfires, Council's planned burns and potential flash flooding.

Welcome to our new residents and I hope you find this information helpful.

As the local Councillor, I visit most P&C meetings as regularly as possible. The common theme of concern in recent meetings is the use of E-Scooters and E-Bikes. Safety is everyone's responsibility. Please speak to your children about the importance of obeying the road rules. The Queensland Government has some simple rules that must be adhered too. Please see below details and a link for further information.

Rules for personal mobility devices

You can use a broad range of personal mobility devices in Queensland. They are a type of vehicle so you must comply with the rules for personal mobility devices and the general road rules.

To ride a personal mobility device, you must be either:

- · at least 16 years or,
- at least 12 years and supervised by an adult while riding the device.

Remember, people of all abilities use our paths and not everyone can easily move around a device that might be blocking the path.

If when riding a personal mobility device you break the road rules, you may be given the same fines as motorists but you will not accumulate demerit points.

Moreton Bay to host 2027 Women's Softball World Cup Finals

City of Moreton Bay has been selected to host the prestigious WBSC Women's Softball World Cup Finals in April 2027, marking the first time Australia has welcomed the event since its 1965 debut at the inaugural Softball World Championships. This will be the largest ever sporting event held in our city. Eight nations will compete at Talobilla Park in Kippa-Ring from 5–11 April, bringing international attention, an estimated 10,500 visitor nights, and around \$6.3 million in economic benefit. Hosting the World Cup will showcase local talent, inspire the next generation of players, and build excitement in the lead-up to the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

\$180m resort and commercial project set for North Lakes

North Lakes is set to become home to a landmark \$180 million tourism and dining precinct featuring an upscale 5-star hotel, highend restaurants and boutique retail. Dubbed a 'mini-James St', the proposed development features 130 hotel rooms, a substantial accommodation boost as City of Moreton Bay heads towards being a host venue for the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games. There is something for everyone in this development.

City of Moreton Bay has awarded local developer Comiskey Group the tender to deliver the transformative development on a 1.72-hectare site in the heart of North Lakes, formerly known as the Laguna site. This site is located on North Lakes Drive opposite Westfield North Lakes.

We put the call out last August for an iconic development that would elevate City of Moreton Bay on the tourism map, and Comiskey Group's vision ticks every box with world class design by Bureau Proberts, genuine community benefit, and serious economic horsepower for our city.

Local residents and businesses will benefit greatly from the planned development. Over its first five years alone, this proposed resort will inject an estimated \$538 million into the local economy and support 883 jobs in construction and operation. Currently, we have 2,796 residents working in the accommodation and food services industry with almost 1,500 of those having to find work outside of the area. By creating 335 new jobs on site and through local supply chains, this proposed precinct will let many more in our community have careers closer to home and lift local spending.

The development is set to be a boon for City of Moreton Bay's major events industry, which was valued at more than \$50 million last year although its growth has been hamstrung by a lack of hotel rooms. It's also poised to capture a new and untapped business events and conference market and serve as a base for training camps for national teams and major sporting events.

The resort will blend luxury accommodation with premium food, boutique retail, generous green spaces and event experiences to create a destination locals will love, and visitors will travel for. Designed by Bureau Proberts, the visionary architects behind West Village at West End, the new precinct will create a vibrant cultural hub in the centre of North Lakes. Detailed design and approvals for the landmark North Lakes tourism and commercial precinct are expected to progress this year, with construction scheduled to begin in 2026.

Council will continue working closely with the Comiskey Group to maximise local procurement, training and tourism marketing opportunities.

About the proposed landmark \$180 million North Lakes tourism and commercial project:

- Stage 1: A 130 room, 5 star resort featuring a luxury lagoon pool, high end dining, boutique retail, an upscale Signature Comiskey Group hospitality venue and event spaces for up to 800 guests.
- Stage 2: Expansion of the retail and dining village and other complementary experiences.
- New economic activity of \$538 million in the first five years.
