Severe weather season is on the way and now is the perfect time to get ready for storms, fires and floods with this handy checklist:

- Clean up your property clear your gutters, mow your lawn and tidy the yard.
- Know your risk and check your household flood check property report and our flood maps.
- Prepare an emergency kit containing supplies that last 3 days with no electricity or water.
- Have a plan make a household emergency plan so everyone knows what to do in the event of a disaster.
- Sign up for MoretonAlert get notifications for bushfires and severe weather in your area.
- Check out our Disaster Dashboard find road closures, power outages and more.

Cat and dog registration due

With more than 90,000 registered pets across our city, registration helps us get your pet home safely if they go missing. Annual dog and cat registrations are due by 30 September 2025. Look out for your renewal notice in the mail or go paperless by registering online. Pet registration, microchipping and ID tags are mandatory for all cats and dogs, and are key in helping us reunite you with your pet if they ever wander off. Reimagining a vibrant new precinct for the Hills District

The Hills District has always been a place where community and nature thrive side by side. Now, we have a unique opportunity to build on that legacy at 303 Dawson Parade.

Since 2019, Council has worked closely with residents to explore how this well-loved site can evolve. With over 670 community responses and strong support for retaining key facilities like the library, PCYC, and community centre, it is clear we need a welcoming and accessible hub.

Imagine a place where families can enjoy a storytime session, teens can access fitness programs, older residents can connect over community events and families can enjoy free movie nights – all surrounded by open space, shaded paths, and native landscaping.

The market sounding process which commenced earlier this year is continuing and we hope to inform the community of its outcomes by the end of 2025 or early 2026.

Starting from design to construction and operation, the precinct will support local jobs and boost the local economy.

The 2025-26 Budget includes funding to progress planning and design, and Council is inviting creative ideas through a market sounding process. These ideas must meet key criteria: delivering essential community facilities, retaining green space, and ensuring financial sustainability.

Upcoming Albany Creek Active Transport Project

Works will start in September and will take approximately 30 weeks, weather permitting. The project will include:

- 1,500 metres of upgraded pathway, from Old Northern Road, Albany Creek and extending west by widening the length along James Cash Court
- Pathway upgrades of the existing offroad path network including to and under South Pine Road and Stanton Reserve
- Construction of a new path on the eastern side of Barwing Court and Kingfisher Street through to Faheys Road West.

Project construction continues

Construction crews are progressing with the works on the Collins Road/Cabbage Tree Creek active transport connection. At the time of writing preparations are being made for the installation of the new creek crossing.

Other projects underway include the second stage area for George Willmore Park and the lighting safety upgrade at James Drysdale Reserve.
