Regional Economic Development Grant Guidelines

Introduction

The Regional Economic Development Grant Program aims to support community organisations in the development and implementation of initiatives that advance the Moreton Bay regional economy and align with the four pillars of the Moreton Bay Regional Economic Development Strategy:

- Leadership and Identity
- Industry Advancement
- Trade and Investment
- Knowledge, Innovation and Entrepreneurship

In addition, the program aims to contribute to the Moreton Bay Regional Economic Development Strategy's 'Bigger, Bolder, Brighter' goals.

The Regional Economic Development Grants and these guidelines are governed by the City of Moreton Bay Community Grants Policy (No. 2150-030).

Grant applications will be invited in October and March as outlined below.

Definitions

Community organisation means:

- a) an entity that carries on activities for a public purpose; or
- b) another entity whose primary object is not directed at making a profit.

Who Can Apply?

Eligible applicants	A community organisation that applies for funding under this grant must		
	meet the following criteria:		
	Be based in City of Moreton Bay and/or can demonstrate that the		
	proposed project will benefit residents of the city;		
	Have \$20 million public liability insurance if required by Council;		
	Have no outstanding debts to City of Moreton Bay; and		
	Have no overdue acquittals and satisfactorily accounted to Council		
	for the expenditure of any previous Council funding.		



Ineligible	The following are ineligible organisation types:	
applicants	For profit organisations;	
	Government departments and agencies;	
	Political groups; and	
	Unincorporated community groups.	
	Individuals are not eligible to apply for funding under this grant.	

Grant Information

Eligible projects	Grants are available for projects and initiatives that positively contribute towards the economic performance of the Moreton Bay Region and support the achievement of the strategic goals and aspirations of the Moreton Bay Regional Economic Development Strategy. Projects must deliver benefits to a number of local businesses and may include, but are not limited to: Business mentoring Business planning workshops and resources Business engagement and development events Business diversification or supply chain studies Industry or business community website resources Local economic activations	
	Collective precinct identity and/or profiling initiatives Projects must be completed within 14 months from the round closing date.	
Ineligible projects / expenses	 Ineligible projects and expenses include: Projects that do not meet the requirements of Council's Community Grants Policy or the Regional Economic Development Grants Program guidelines; Ongoing operational or recurrent costs including, but not limited to salaries, rent, fuel and insurance; Equipment purchases or capital infrastructure projects; Prize money, prizes, gifts or trophies; Payment of debt; Political activities; Projects run solely for commercial profit; Items included in another Council grant application; and, Fundraising activities. 	
Funding amount	Up to \$10,000 (GST inclusive) is available per application. Council reserves the right to part fund any application. Retrospective funding of projects is not available.	
Lodging an application	Applications must be submitted online via Council's grants and funding webpage www.mbrc.qld.gov.au/grants/ . Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.	
Supporting documents	 Current public liability insurance certificate; Most recent audited or reviewed financial statements; and Quotes for individual expenditure items \$500 or above. 	



Assessment criteria	 Eligible applications will be assessed against the following criteria: Demonstrated need for the project Alignment with the strategic goals, pathways and priority industries of the Moreton Bay Regional Economic Development Strategy Clear articulation of the expected outcomes of the project Evidence of partnerships and collaborations in the delivery of the project Demonstrated value for money Demonstrated capacity of the applicant to deliver the project
Terms and Conditions	Successful applicants are required to comply with the <u>terms and</u> <u>conditions</u> associated with Council's financial support, attached to the letter of offer.
	Successful projects must not commence prior to receiving written notification from Council.
Unsuccessful applicants	Unsuccessful applicants may seek feedback on their application by contacting a Grants Officer (see contact details below).
